1. Project/Event Title. (50 word limit)
2. How did you hear about the Beloved Community Fund? (200 word limit)
3. Describe your project. Include project goals, methods used to reach objectives and project relevance at this point in time. Please be descriptive about how arts and culture is being used to advance the goals of the event. (200 word limit)
4. How will this project advance racial justice and build voice, self determination and/or power of communities of color in Oakland?
5. Tell us about where the public event portion of the project will be held. (200 word limit)
6. When will the project/event happen?
7. Describe the target audience/community for your project. What is your outreach and recruitment plan for the target audience/community? How many people do you hope to engage? (200 word limit)
8. When your project is completed, what do you hope will be different? How will you know you've been successful? What evaluation methods will you use to measure success? (200 word limit)
9. List other funders and/or potential funders and amounts committed or requested for the specified project and describe what efforts your organization will make to obtain additional sources of funding including planned fundraising activities. (200 word limit)

Please include a written Budget Narrative with your Financial Budget. The purpose of the Budget Narrative is to supplement the brief information provided in the Financial Budget. It should justify how the budget items are necessary to implement the project goals and objectives, and to accomplish the proposed outcomes. It is a guide to help Akonadi Foundation staff to fully understand the budgetary needs of the applicant, and to provide more descriptive information regarding the costs. Together, the Budget Narrative and Financial Budget should provide a complete financial and qualitative description that supports the proposed project plan.
